Going Home Genesis 30:25-33:20

I. Prompted by Stress – 30:25-31:2

- 1. God uses Jacob's situation to prompt his return Going home means facing his brother Esau
- 2. Stress at his occupation 30:25-31:2 Jacob expresses his desire to go home - 25, 26 Laban offers new contract for him to stay 27-34 Jacob can keep all of the miss-marked animals God blessed Jacob with a large herd – 35-43 Laban's sons are envious and angry – 31:1 Jacob has taken over their flocks and herds Jacob recognizes a change in Laban – 31:2 Things have gone from bad to worse

II. Prompted by God - 31:3-55

- 1. God directs Jacob with a promise 31:3 Return home to family and I will be with you
- 2. Jacob shares his desire with his wives 4-13 Tells them of the situation with their father – 4-10 6 Jacob worships God as His God – 18-20 He tells them of God's direction – 1-13
- 3. Rachel and Leah agree to go 14-16
- 4. Jacob's family leaves without notice 17-21 Unknown to Jacob, Rachel steals father's gods
- 5. Laban learns of their going & pursues 22-23 After 7 days he catches up with them
- 6. God warns Laban not to hurt Jacob 24
- 7. Laban scolds Jacob but can do no more-25-29 God's warning kept him from retaliating
- 8. Laban does want his gods returned 30-35 Rachel's theft goes undetected
- 9. Jacob expresses his anger to Laban 36-42 God protected him with Laban's mistreatment
- 10. Laban proposes a truce 43-55 They agree to stay away from each other They then depart in peace.

III. Preparing for Esau - 32:1-32

- 1. Going home means facing his brother Esau
- 2. Angels assure him of God's presence 1, 2 God will protect and provide for him
- 3. Jacob sends messengers to Esau 3-6 They announce his return and ask for grace
- 4. Their report to Jacob causes great fear 6-8 400 men are coming with Esau to meet you Is this an army or a welcoming party? Jacob plans so some of his family may escape
- 5. Jacob prays for God's protection 9-12 He pleads for mercy based upon God's promises
- 6. He continues to plan for meeting Esau 13-23 He prepares a gift to appease his brother - 13-21 He sends his family on ahead of him - 22, 23

7. All alone he wrestles with the Lord – 24-32 The Lord initiates this struggle that lasts all night The Lord disables Jacob with just a touch Jacob seeks a blessing from the Lord Jacob's name is changed to Israel (prince with God)

Jacob has a lasting reminder of who God is He walks with a limp from God's powerful touch God is sovereign, He's in control, no need to fear

IV. Peaceful Meeting – 33:1-20

- 1. In one sense nothing has changed 1-3 Esau is still coming toward him with 400 men - 1 Jacob follows the plan he had made -2, 3But all has changed because God is in control
- 2. Esau runs to meet & warmly greet him 4-7 He meets all of Jacob's family
- 3. Jacob insists on giving Esau his gift 8-11
- 4. Jacob declines Esau's offer 12-15
- 5. They go their separate ways 16-17
