Invasions Sweep the Middle East Daniel 11:1-35

I. Troubles Ahead for Israel - Dan. 11-12

- 1. Daniel troubled by Israel's future 10:1-3
- 2. Daniel 11:1-35 is prophecy now fulfilled It focuses on nations that will impact Israel
- 3. Fulfilled prophecy confirms Scripture This passage has been fulfilled in great detail Critics say this must have been written later
- 4. Fulfilled prophecy assures future prophecy If we study what God predicted in the past We can rest secure in what is yet to come Fulfilled prophecy declares sovereignty of God

II. Two Centuries of Invasion - 11:1-20 A. History under Persia – 2

Four Kings of Persia yet to rule over Israel Cambyses – son of Cyrus - (529-522 B.C.) Pseudo-Smerdis (522-521 B.C.) – short reign Darius I Hystapes (521-486 B.C.) Xerxes (496-465 B.C.) - Ahasuerus of Esther Most important and wealthiest of the four kings He Wanted to extend his empire to Greece

B. History under Greece – 3-20

- Alexander the Great 3, 4
 He would punish Persia for invading Greece 334-330 conquered Asia Minor (Turkey), Syria, Egypt & all of Persian Empire (as far as India) At his peak, Alexander dies, empire is divided - 4
- Four Generals divide empire in 4 parts 4 Seleucus ruled over Syria & Mesopotamia Ptolemy ruled over Egypt Lysimacus ruled over Thrace & Asia Minor Cassander ruled over Macedonia & Greece
- Syria & Egypt war over Israel 11:5-20
 Israel between 2 rival powers, north & south
 Ptolemy I of Egypt & Seleucus I of Syria war 5
 Seleucus gains dominion over Ptolemy 305B.C.
 Israel is between these two waring factions
 Ptolemy I died in 285 B.C. His son reigned
 Seleucus murdered (281 B.C.) Grandson reigns
- Ptolemy II & Antiochus II make alliance 6 Ptolemy's daughter Bernice married to Antiochus
 - Ptolemy dies, Antiochus restores 1st wife Laodice (1st wife) has Bernice killed She poisions Antiochus
 - Puts her son Seleucus II on throne (246-227) Ptolemy III and Seleucus II - 7-9
- Ptolemy, Bernice's brother avenges her death Invades Syria successfully, strengthens his reign
 - Seleucus' sons strike back at Egypt 10 Seleucus III (227-223) & Antiochus III Antiochus takes power (223-187)

Ptolemy IV & Antiochus III (The Great) - 11-13 Ptolemy IV is successful defeats Antiochus III Antiochus (the Great) returns to defeat Ptolemy- 13 Philip V of Macedon joins Antiochus - 14-16 Israel gets involved (14) and suffers for it (16) Antiochus the Great takes control over Israel Antiochus gave daughter to Ptolemy V – 17 Cleopatra I is married to Ptolemy V It failed; she sided with husband not her father Antiochus attacks Greece, is defeated – 18-19 Defeated by Roman leader Scipio Antiochus the Great dies soon after that defeat Seleucus IV (Philopator) followed his father - 20 He oppressed Israel by raising absorbent taxes He plundered the Temple of much of its riches He died suddenly (Possibly poisoned)

III. Ten Years of Wickedness - Daniel 11:21-31

- Antiochus IV takes Syrian throne 21, 22 Chose title "Epiphanes" – "the Illustrious one" Nicknamed "Epimanes" – "the Madman" Called "a vile person" or "a contemptible person" Antiochus seized power over young true heir He deposed Onias, Jewish High Priest Prince of the covenant
- 2. Successful in his attack on Egypt 23-24 Won acceptance by winning a battle with Egypt His power grew with the help of a small group Sought peace by redistributing the wealth - 24 Took from rich to give to his people
- 3. Consolidated power attacking Egypt 25-27 He won the battle over Egyptian army – 25-26 Made treaty with Egypt deceitfully - 27
- 4. On return he plundered the temple 28
- 5. Invasion of Egypt is turned back 29-30 Ships of Chittim may refer to the Romans Romans forced him to give up attacks on Egypt
- Antiochus takes out anger on Israel 30-32 Renegade Jews betrayed, sided with him – 30-32 Polluted Temple with offering of pig's blood - 31

IV. God gives Israel Victory – 11:32-35

- God raised up faithful men to fight 32-34
 Faithful ones led by a Jewish priest & his sons
 Priest, Mattathias, sons Simon & Judas
 Judas nicknamed Maccabeus, "the hammerer"
 Many die but eventually the battle is won
 Dec. 14, 165 B.C. Temple purified, rededicated
 Celebration gave rise to Hanukkah
 (Festival of Lights)
- Two years later Antiochus died in Persia
- 2. Daniel sees implications for later time 35 This prophecy is fulfilled with Antiochus He becomes a picture of ruler yet to come (Antichrist)
 - Israel's troubles are not over yet
