## Disciples in Training Luke 9:1-36

#### I. Commitment to a Mission - 9:1-9

- His mission requires authority & power 1
   It is His mission & only He can accomplish it
   He delegates authority & power to His disciples
   He gave them power over demons and diseases
- Mission is to proclaim His message 2
   Proclaim the Kingdom of God
   Healing was to demonstrate it is God's message
- 3. His messengers trust His provision 3-4
  Travel light & trust God to provide
  He will provide people to meet their needs
- 4. Not all will welcome you 5-9 Shake the dust off & move on to next town Don't be discouraged by rejection Jesus was not always accepted People did not understand who He was John the Baptist, Elijah or another prophet

# II. Compassion for People - 10-17

- They reported to Jesus 10
   They told Him all that they had done
   He took them to a private place
   To rest and be restored for ministry
- 2. Crowds of people found them 11Jesus graciously received themHe taught them & healed their diseases
- There was a need for food 12
   Disciples spoke to Jesus about it
   Suggested Jesus send people away for food
- Jesus challenged them to act 13
   They only had 5 loaves & 2 fish
   Only solution was to go and buy food
- 5. Jesus ministered to their need 14-16
  Had disciples sit the 5,000 in groups of 50
  Blessed the food & gave to disciples to distribute
- 6. All were filled & 12 baskets remained 17

#### III. Confession of Christ - 9:18-22

- Discipleship must focus on Jesus -18
   It does not focus on us but on our Lord
   Disciples must know who Jesus is
- 2. Jesus asks a broad question 18-19
  Who do people say that I am?
  Disciples reflect what they have heard
  John the Baptist, Elijah or one of the prophets
  A prophet of God risen from the dead
- 3. Focus on the real issue 20
  Who do you say that I am?
  Peter answers: "The Christ of God"
  "Christ" means "anointed one"
  "The Christ" means "Messiah"
  The promised one who will rule & reign
  4. Jesus adds a restraint 21-22

Charged & commanded them not to tell
There is more in God's plan yet to be done
His mission must first deal with human sin
He must suffer, die and rise again
Work of redemption must be completed
The kingdom reign must wait until later

## IV. Cost of Discipleship - 23-26

- 1. Concept of discipleship 23
  One who follows, learns from another
  That requires denial of self
  Surrender of one's own will
  Take the cross daily
  This speaks of death to self
  And follow the Master
  That is the only way to truly learn from Him
- 2. Choice of discipleship 24-25
  If Jesus is the only way to eternal life
  To choose not to follow Him is to lose life
  If choosing Him brings life it is no loss
  Gaining everything else cannot be compared
- 3. Consequence of choice 26

  To be ashamed of Him now sets our future

  When He comes in His glory we are shut out
  How can we be ashamed of One who is life

## V. Constrained by His Glory - 27-36

- A promise His Glory 27
   Some of His disciples would see His glory
- 2. A preview of His glory 28-33

  Eight days later Jesus went up a mountain

  Went up to pray, took Peter, James & John

  As He prayed He was transfigured 29

  His countenance was altered, His robe glistened

  Moses & Elijah talked with Him 30-31

  Spoke of His impending crucifixion

  Reaction of disciples to this 32-33

  Stricken with awe in a deep sleep

  When they awoke they saw His glory

  And they also saw Moses & Elijah

  Peter suggested they erect 3 monuments
- 3. A voice from Heaven 34-36
  A cloud appeared & surrounded them
  They were in awe as they entered the cloud
  A voice spoke from the cloud
  This is my beloved Son: hear Him
  After the voice they saw Jesus only
  He is the preeminent one
  Disciple left in silence
