Investing in the Future Luke 16

I. Wise to Invest in the Future -16:1-8

- Rich man and his steward 1
 Jesus did not say that this was a parable
 He may have been commenting on a fact
 - "There was a certain rich man who had a steward"

Steward was accused of wasting his master's goods

- Steward was called in to account 2 Steward must give an account Result is the steward will lose his position
- 3. The steward made a plan 3-4
 He didn't want to dig or beg
 He would use the time he had to prepare
 He would make friends with those who owed
 That they might find a position for him
- He carried out his plan 5-7
 He called each of his master's debtors Asked each how much they owed Settled each debt at a reduced rate One cut 50% another cut 20%
- 5. Lord's words of commendation 8
 He did not commend him as being righteous
 He still called him an "unjust steward"
 But what he did was wise
 Used current resources to prepare for future
 At times unbelievers act more wisely than

At times unbelievers act more wisely than believers

II. How to Invest in Eternity – 16:9-13

- 1. Learn from this story 9
- Jesus is not commending dishonesty But there is an element of truth here Use what resources you have to invest in eternity

Remember death ends this opportunity

- We are all stewards 10-12
 Faithfulness is tested in small ways
 If you are not faithful using earthly resources
 Why should you be trusted with "true riches"
 If proven unfaithful with another's resources
 Why should you be given "your own"
- 3. You can't serve God & material gain 13 You must choose to invest in eternity

III. Obeying God's Word – 16:14-18

- 1. Serving God is investing in eternity Serving God is obeying His Word
- Pharisees' rebuttal 14
 They heard what Jesus said but derided Him They were covetous sought for material gain
- 3. Jesus' response to Pharisees 15-18 You twist God's law to justify yourself

You claim you are pursuing God's kingdom But you are not walking in harmony with God's Word

Their view of marriage & divorce - Matt. 9:3-12

IV. Results of Investing - 16:19-31

- 1. Earthly & Eternal value system Serving God or serving material things
- Jesus told them of two men 19-21 Rich man who dressed and ate well – 19 Lazarus, a beggar covered with sores – 20-21 Desired only crumbs from rich man's table Laid at rich man's gate, dogs licked his sores
- Death came to both men 22
 Beggar died carried by angels to Abraham Rich man died and was buried
- Rich man is in hell, tormented 23
 Sees Abraham & Lazarus in his bosom They are far removed from where he is
- 5. He cries out for mercy 24 He bases his claim on being a child of Abraham Desires only a drop of water from Lazarus' finger
- He is tormented in the flame
- Abraham's response 25-26
 Remember you had resources in your lifetime Lazarus had very little of world's values
 Now he is comforted & you are tormented
 You had opportunity to invest in eternity
 With one who was right at your gate
 There is a great gulf separating us 26
- There is no further opportunity to change 7. Rich man's final plea – 27-28
- Send Lazarus to my family to warn them I have 5 brothers who follow my way
- 8. Faith is determining issue 29-31
 They have Moses & Prophets
 Believe what God says in His Word
 Rich man pleas for a miracle 30
 They would believe if one returned from death
 Not even a miracle would persuade them
 - Think of all of Jesus' miracles There was another Lazarus who rose from death
