Israel Desires Change 1 Samuel 8-10

I. Asking for a King - 7:15-8:22

- Theocracy is rule by God
 God's laws given to Moses for Israel
 Human leader was to execute law of God
- Samuel is that leader for Israel 7:15-17
 He is the last of the Judges
 He is also God's prophet
 God speaks to and through Samuel
- 3. But Samuel is old 8:1

 Some kind of change is necessary

 Samuel made his sons judges over Israel
- 4. But his sons did not follow him 8:2-3
 They served for personal gain (money)
 Accepting bribes that perverted justice
- 5. Elders used this to request a king 5-6
 They want a king like all the other nations
 Samuel was displeased & prayed to God
- 6. God gives direction to Samuel 7-9
 Listen and give them what they want 7
 It is not a rejection of you but of me (God)
 Further indication of Israel's rebellion 8
 Forsaken God to serve other gods
 Listen but protest and warn them 9
 Make them aware of the consequences
- 7. Samuel delivers God's message 10-18

 He numbers the consequences of their choice

 He will take your sons to serve him 11-12

 In his court and in his army

 He will take your daughters to serve him 13

 As cooks and bakers

 He will take your lands 14

 He will give them to his servants

 He will increase your taxes 15-17

 Your resources will be used by your king

 You will cry to God but He will not hear you
- 8. Israel refused to listen 19-22
 They want a king like other nations 19-20
 That he might give them justice & fight their battles
 God tells Samuel to give them a king 21-22

II. Theocracy or Monarchy?

- 1. Does Theocracy exclude a king for Israel? Are Gen. 17:6; Deut. 17:14-20 a concession?
- 2. Is God's plan for king rule as His regent?
- 3. God will allow humans to choose

 He will allow them to suffer consequences
- 4. He will set His king on the throne
 Ultimately Messiah will rule God's Kingdom

III. Qualifications of Saul – 9:1-14

- 1. Came from a strong family 9:1
- 2. Physically attractive & well respected 2

- 3. Faithful in service to his father 3-5
 Spent days searching for his father's donkeys
- Open to suggestion of his servant 6-14
 Would seek help of the prophet (Samuel)
 Continued until they found him 14

IV. Saul is Anointed - 9:15-10:13

- 1. God identifies Saul for Samuel 15-17
- 2. Samuel invites Saul to dinner 18-19
- 3. Samuel hints about greater things 20-21 Saul humbly declines such thoughts 21
- 4. Saul stayed with Samuel 22-26
- 5. Samuel anoints Saul as king 9:27-10:1
- 6. Samuel told him what's ahead 10:2-13

 The donkeys have been found 2

 You will meet prophets who will prophesy 3-5

 God's Spirit will come on you (bring change) 6-13

V. Saul Selected by Lot – 10:17-27

- 1. Samuel gathers Israel together 17-19 Reminds them of their choice
- 2. Tribes & families selected by lot 20 Benjamin and Saul were chosen
- 3. Saul modestly hid himself 21-23
- 4. Saul is announced by Samuel 24-25
 He also tells them how kingdom would function
- 5. Saul went home to wait coronation 26-27 No reaction to those opposed to him
