Condemned & Crucified Matthew 27

I. The Roman Trial – 27:1-26

- Jesus is turned over to Rome 1-2 Jewish Council condemn Him to death But they cannot execute their prisoner They are under Roman authority Both Jew and Gentile condemn Him to death He must bear the curse of crucifixion – Gal. 3:13
- 2. Judas' remorse 3-10
- Realized his guilt, betraying Jesus 3-4 Tried to give back the 30 pieces of silver He confesses sin – betrayed innocent blood Leaving the money he committed suicide – 5 He hanged himself
- Leaders troubled with blood money 6-8 Could not put it in the treasury – 6 Bought a field to bury strangers – 7-8
- 4. Scripture again is fulfilled 9-10
- The trial begins 11-14
 Pilate asks are you King of the Jews? -11
 Jesus answers in the affirmative
 Jewish leaders make accusations 12-14
 Jesus does not respond to accusations
 Pilate is amazed at His restraint
- 6. Pilate makes an offer 15-25
- Looks for a way out of his dilemma Offers Jesus or Barabbas He knew their motives – envy – 18 He heard his wife's advice – 19 But he felt the political pressure – 20-22 Leaders incited the crowd to cry for Barabbas He tried to absolve himself of guilt – 23-24
- He washed his hands claiming innocence The Jews accept responsibility – 25 His blood is on us and our children
- 7. Pilate condemns Jesus to death 26 Had Him scourged & crucified

II. Soldiers Mock Jesus – 27-32

- Mocked Him as King of Jews 27-30 Stripped Him of His clothing Dressed Him in a scarlet robe & thorny crown Put a reed in His hand as His scepter Bowed to Him hailing Him as king Spit on Him – Hit Him on the head with the reed
- 2. Re-clothed & led Him to crucify 31-32 Compelled Simon of Cyrene to carry the cross

III. At Golgotha - 33-44

- 1. He refused the drink they offered 33-34 May have been to dull the senses
- 2. They cast lots for His clothes 35

In fulfillment of Scripture - Psa. 22:18

- Crucifixion was a public display 36-44
 People sat down and watched 36
 Accusation was attached to the cross 37
 This is Jesus the King of the Jews
 - Two thieves crucified on either side 38
 - Passing crowds reviled Him 39-40 If you be the Son of God come down from the
 - cross

Religious leaders mocked Him – 41-43 Save yourself and we will believe Even the thieves mocked Him - 44

IV. Significance of His Death – 45-56

- Separation from God 45-46
 hours of darkness over the land Absence of the One who is the light Jesus felt the agony of this separation My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?
- 2. Witnesses did not understand 47-49 Thought He was calling for Elijah to help
- 3. After 3 hours He gave up His life 50 With a loud voice He dismissed His spirit
- 4. Veil in the Temple torn top to bottom 51 Access now open to presence of God
- 5. Graves opened saints arose 52-53 After His resurrection many are raised They appeared in the city of Jerusalem
- Centurion's testimony 54
 Officer & soldiers saw earthquake & miracles They said, "Truly this was the Son of God"
- Women disciples also witnesses 55-56
 Followers of Jesus & ministered to Him Among them: Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James & Joseph, the mother of Zebedee's children

V. Burial of Jesus - 57-66

- 1. Joseph's request to Pilate 57-58 He was a follower of Jesus from Arimathea Asked permission to bury Jesus – granted
- 2. Wrapped the body clean linen 59
- 3. Put it in his own new tomb 60 Rolled a stone over the opening of the tomb
- 4. Women watched the burial 61
- 5. Jewish leaders request security 62-66 Want guards to prevent disciples taking the body Stone was sealed & guards stationed there
