I. Israel is Disobedient - 7:1

- Achan is guilty of greed 1, 20-21
 God's command Josh. 6:18-19
 Material possessions were under a curse
 Valuable metals were consecrated to God
 Achan coveted what he saw 21
 He saw, he coveted and he took
- Disobedience affected Israel 1
 One person's sin can affect others
 Children of Israel committed a trespass
 Anger of the Lord kindled against Israel

II. Defeat is Devastating - 7:2-9

- Israel's battle plan was defective 2, 3
 Scouts sent to evaluate the enemy's strength
 Report reflected a spirit of self-confidence
 God did not direct nor was He consulted
- 2. Israel's army is soundly defeated 4, 536 men died in this battleHearts of people melted became as water
- 3. Joshua & elders wept before God 6-9
 There was deep sorrow and brokenness
 Questioned what God was doing to them
 Why did you bring us over Jordan?
 We should have been content on other side
 Pled for God's honor and glory 9
 What will you do about your great name?

III. Discovering the Problem - 7:10-18

- God put His finger on Sin 10-11
 They transgressed God's covenant
 They took what was cursed
 Marked for destruction
 They stole what belonged to God
 There was deception and cover-up
- 2. God will withdraw from Israel 12
 Unless they deal with the sin
- 3. God gave direction for process 13-15
 How they were to discover the guilty one
 God will indicate guilty one by lots 14
 Go by tribes, families, households, man
 God directs sentence for the guilty
 He shall be burned by fire with all that is his
- 4. Achan is taken with God's plan 16-18 Achan did not attempt to stop process

IV. Dealing with the Sinner - 7:19-26

- 1. Achan acknowledges his guilt 19-21 I saw, I coveted, I took, I hid
- 2. Evidence taken from his tent 22-23
 Evidence shown to people & before the Lord
- 3. Achan & family were executed 24-25 Stoned to death and burned with fire

Cursed things were burned with them

4. Monument built to remind Israel - 26
They must not forget consequences of sin
Justice is a must if God is to be with Israel
Sin affecting all must be dealt with publicly

V. Defeating the Enemy (Ai) - 8:1-29

- 1. The Lord promises victory -1-2
 God will give Israel victory over Ai 1
 God will give the spoils to His people 2
- 2. Lord reveals His battle plan 3-8
 With sin put away God directs His people
 The whole army was to be involved 3
 Plan involved setting up an ambush 4-8
- Joshua & Israel follow God's plan 9-29
 City was destroyed, burned with fire 19, 28
 The people of Ai were killed 21-26
 King was captured, taken to Joshua 23
 People were given the spoils 27
 Jericho was first-fruits spoils belonged to God
 Jericho fell by God's hand the spoils were His
 Now people fought and they are given the spoils
 The King of the city was hanged 29

VI. Dedication to God's Law - 8:30-35

- After defeat, a review of the law Must learn the importance of obedience
- 2. Joshua build an altar on Mt. Ebal 30-31 Led people in worship, commitment to God In accordance with Deut. 27:9-26
- 3. Wrote copy of Law on altar stones 32
- 4. Blessings & Curses pronounced 33-35
 Blessings from one mountain, curses from other
- 4. God's Law was to be law of the Land God's commandments to govern His people
